Prize money - over \$100,000

Please read this carefully to ensure prompt payment of your prize money.

Height classes, Ivory, Pearl and Opal series will be paid in cash from the event office. All other Championship and Series prize money will be direct debited to your account.

It is vital that you provide the correct BSB and account number when entering the show. If these details are supplied correctly prize money will be transferred within three weeks from the end of the show. Unclaimed prize money will be held for no more than three months from the end of the show.

Conditions of Entry

This event will run under EA/FEI rules and regulations. The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to change or amend the program at their discretion. All owners and competitors will be personally responsible for damages to any third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Please ensure the safety of your children whilst in proximity to horses.

Conduct of the Organising Committee

The Technical Delegate, Ground Jury, Officials, Boneo Park and Equestrian Australia (EA) are responsible for ensuring Horse Welfare guidelines are observed. Additionally, the above-mentioned groups are responsible for ensuring that EA and Boneo Park Codes of Conduct are adhered to at all times. General Regs Article 116.11 - The OC may at their absolute discretion and shall, if they consider it expedient to do so, decline to receive any entry or return any fee without being liable for any compensation.

Block Entry

There will be a block entry for Children's, Junior, Young Rider and Senior Championships. The Future Stars, Mini Prix, Amateur, OTT, Ruby & Emerald Series will also be block entry. The block entry for these Championships/Series will include two qualifying classes and a final class for those that qualify. The Ivory, Pearl and Opal series will also be block entry. The block entry for these Series will include two qualifying classes for Ivory and three qualifying classes for Pearl and Opal and a final class for those who qualify.

Scratching / refunds of entries

All scratchings prior to close of entries will be refunded in full less a \$60 administration fee. Once the entries have closed, no refunds will be given unless a veterinary or medical certificate is provided within seven days of the event. If a veterinary or medical certificate is supplied within the given timeframe 50% of entry fees paid will be refunded. All scratchings must be emailed to events@boneopark.com.au

Late entries

Once the entry checks have been completed there will be no further late entries accepted. The only exception is the height classes and the speed class where late entries will be accepted subject to there being room in the class. Once the show is underway there is no transferring from one class to another.

Refunds of stables/yards/campsites

More than seven days from the event, stable, yard and camping fees will be refunded in full less a \$60 administration fee. Within seven days of the event, refunds, less the \$60 administration fee, will be given if the stable/yard/campsite can be filled. No stable refund will occur once the event has started. For biosecurity, you must clear any stabling changes with the Event Secretary or Stable Manager.

Cancellation of event

If Boneo Park cancels the event due to Covid-19, extreme weather conditions, low numbers or other unforeseen circumstances, Boneo Park reserves the right to retain a \$60 administration fee per rider. All other money paid will be refunded. There will be no refunds once the event has started.

Starts per horse / Riders per horse

Horses may only start in a maximum of two classes per day.

Each horse is only permitted one rider for the event. This includes the Speed Championship and Open height classes, no exceptions.

Riders and Owners

All riders and owners must be current financial members of EA with no exception. All horses and ponies must hold current EA registration with the exception of those competing in the Ivory, Pearl and Opal series.

EA age rules

The following EA age rules apply:

- Children – Riders are considered children up until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 14 years old.
- Junior – Riders are considered Juniors, from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years old.
- Young Rider – Riders are considered Young riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years old.
- Senior Rider – Riders are considered Senior riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 18.
- Open height classes - Riders may take part in open competitions 1.20m and above from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12.

Dress Code

Riders in all competition rings must be in correct dress unless otherwise instructed by the judge. It is compulsory for athletes to wear a properly fastened safety EA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. The only exception to this is Senior athletes may remove their helmet at the presentation in the competition arena only. All helmets must be tagged.

Presentations

Presentations will be mounted, and riders must wear their correct attire. Riders who are not available for presentations or who do not fulfill any media commitments that may be required by the OC, may forfeit all prize money. Winners of classes may be required to participate in photo and media obligations.

All competitors are required to stay at Boneo Park until the completion of the final presentations.

Stallions

The OC follows the EA Stallion Code of Conduct.

Dogs

Dogs must be kept on a leash and under effective control at all times. Dogs are not permitted in warm up or competition areas.

Boneo Park reserves the right to change or amend the program at their discretion.

1. Nomination Conditions for Championship Titles

The following rules are to be used for all Championship divisions (Senior, Young Rider, Junior and Children's) and Teams Competitions (Senior, Young Rider and Junior).

The Championship comprises three competitions, two qualifying competitions and a final competition, each taking place on a different day. For the Senior Australian Championship there must be a break of one day between the second and third competitions. It is recommended that for the other Championships, where possible, there is a break of one day between the second and third competitions.

The obstacle dimensions and speed of the competitions are to be advised in the Championship schedule.

Allocation of Points for the First and Second Qualifying Competitions

The winner of each competition gets one point more than the number of starters in the first qualifying competition. The second placed gets two points less than the winner, the third placed three points less than the winner, and so on.

Athletes eliminated or retiring: Athletes who have been eliminated or have retired in the initial round of the first two competitions do not get points.

Equality of points among Athletes: Points won by Athletes who are tied are added up and divided equally. Fractions of 0.5 and more are rounded up; fractions of less than 0.5 are rounded down.

Transformation of points to penalties

After the second qualifying competition points are transformed into penalties. The Athlete with the highest number of points after the two competitions will have 0 penalties. For all other Athletes the number of penalties will be calculated by multiplying with the coefficient of 0.50 the difference between their number of points and the points of the leading Athlete after the two competitions. In this procedure all decimals are rounded down.

Classification

The overall Champion will be the Athlete with the lowest number of penalties after the three competitions. An Athlete who qualifies for round B of the third and final competition but who does not start in that competition will be ranked after Athletes who started in both round A and Round B of the final competition. If Athletes are tied for first place after the three competitions, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a reduced course of at least six obstacles. In case of equality of penalties and time in this jump-off a second jump-off, against the clock, will be held over the same course. Athletes not in the jump-off but tying on penalties will be separated for the purpose of the final overall classification by their time in the second round of the third competition.

Starting order for Second Qualifying Competition and Final

In the second qualifying competition, the starting order is according to the reverse order of points allocated after the first qualifying competition. The starting order in rounds A and B of the third competition is, respectively, according to the reverse order of penalties (i.e. points transformed into penalties) after the second qualifying competition, and after round A of the third competition. Athletes with equality of points (after the first qualifying competition) or penalties (after the second qualifying competition or after round A of the third competition) will retain the same starting order among themselves as in the previous competition or round, whichever is applicable.

Design and construction

The design and construction of all obstacles with regard to safety and technical suitability must be approved by the Technical Delegate and Course Designer. The minimum diameter of poles used in all Championship Competitions must be at least 9 cm. Should a dispute arise relating to these obstacles, the Technical Delegate has the final decision.

Water jump

The water jump must be used in the first qualifier with rails above, and without rails in the first round of the final competition of the Championship for Seniors, Young Riders and Juniors. For Seniors it must be dug in. An above ground water jump is allowed for Young Riders and Juniors.

First Qualifying Competition

The First Qualifying Competition constitutes Part 1 of the Teams Competition.

This First Qualifying Competition is conducted over a big Table A course and judged under Table C (JRs Art. 239 and 263) without a jump-off in the event of equality for first place.

The First Qualifying Competition for the Children's Championship will be conducted under Table A against the clock, Article 238.2.1. There will be no jump-off in the event of equality for first place.

Athletes will be allocated points for their placing according to penalties and time.

Obstacles: 12 to 14 obstacles, including one double and one treble, or two or three doubles.

Height: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height.

Length: 500 m (min) to 600 m (max).

Starting order: The starting order for the first Competition is a random draw.

Second Qualifying Competition

The Second Qualifier first round constitutes Part 2 of the Teams Competition

Conduct, Table, Speed

This Second Qualifying Competition is conducted over one round run under Table A against the clock at a speed of 375 m per minute with one jump-off. (JRs Article 238 2.2)

Athletes and Horses which are tied for first place at the conclusion of the first round will jump off against the clock.

Obstacles: 12 to 14 obstacles, including one double and one treble or two or three doubles.

Height: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height. A maximum of two spread obstacles with a width of one metre or less may be used. At least two vertical obstacles must be maximum in height. Sloping walls do not count as compulsory vertical obstacles.

Length: 500 m (min) to 700 m (max).

Starting order for Second Qualifying Competition

In the second qualifying competition, the starting order is according to the reverse order of points allocated after the first qualifying competition. Only the Athletes and Horses which have taken part in the first competition, may take part in the second qualifying competition.

Third and Final Competition

For the Senior, the 20 best placed Athletes qualify for the first round (A) of the third and final competition. Athletes on the same penalties for the 20th position will all be eligible to start in round A of the final. If there are less than 20 athletes who have elected to start in round A of the Final, they will be replaced by the next best placed athlete. A maximum of five athletes may be replaced.

Conduct, Table, Speed

The third and final competition is conducted over two rounds (A) and (B) each judged under Table A against the clock with a time allowed at a speed of 375 m per minute.

15 Athletes return for the second round.

Round A

Obstacles: 10 to 12 obstacles, including one double and one treble or three doubles.

Water jump: The water jump must be used in the first round of the final competition. For Seniors it must be dug in. An above ground water jump is allowed for Young Riders and Juniors.

Height: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height. At least two vertical obstacles, which must be at maximum height. Water Jump must be used (see Art. 324.3): maximum 3.6 metres (including the take-off element).

Length: 500 m (min) to 600 m (max).

Starting Order: The starting order in round A of the third and final competition is according to the reverse order of penalties (i.e. points transformed into penalties) after the second qualifying competition.

Round B

Obstacles: A different course from round A comprising eight to 10 obstacles including only one combination (one double or one treble).

Height: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height. At least two vertical obstacles, which must be at maximum height.

Water jump: A water jump may not be included, but an obstacle with water beneath, in front or behind (a so called “Liverpool”) may be included in the course.

Length: 400 m (min) to 500 m (max).

Participation: At the completion of round A of the third and final competition the 15 best placed Senior athletes qualify for the second round, Round (B) of the final. Athletes on the same penalties for the fifteenth position will all be eligible to start in Round B of the final. Athletes who elect not to start in round B will not be replaced and will be placed equal.

Starting order: The starting order in round B of the third and final competition is, according to the reverse order of penalties (i.e. points transformed into penalties) after the second qualifying competition, and after round A of the third and final competition.

Inspection of Course B: Athletes may be invited to inspect the course for round B at the conclusion of round A.

Eligibility for the first round of the Third Final competition

The top 30 Children, top 30 Juniors, top 25 Young Riders and top 20 Seniors qualified after the previous two competitions will be invited to start in the third (final) competition.

Eliminated athletes

Athletes who are eliminated in the first qualifying round are allowed to start in the second qualifying round. However, any athlete eliminated in either the first or second qualifying rounds are not allowed to start in the third (final) competition.

Determination of the Australian Champion

The overall winner will be the competitor with the lowest number of penalties after the three final competitions.

If competitors are tied for first place after the three final competitions, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a reduced course of at least six obstacles. In case of equality of penalties and time in this jump-off a second jump-off, against the clock, will be held over the same course.

How many starts

A rider may not ride more than three horses (if entries permit) in any one championship division. In the case of excessive entries, the OC reserves the right to restrict a rider to two starts.

Competitors, whose age allows them, may compete in two consecutive divisions, i.e. Children's and Junior, Junior and Young Rider or Young Rider and Senior. However, they must compete on different horses.

Horses entered in the Children's Championship may also enter the Opal series. All other Championship horses cannot compete in any other series. Championship horses may compete in open height classes.

Horse Inspection/Trot up

All Athletes competing in the Senior Championship and the Young Rider Championships must present their own horse(s) at the first Horse Inspection, which will be held on the day preceding the first qualifying Competition, and at the second Horse Inspection, which will be held after the second qualifying Competition and prior to the final.

Any Athlete, who fails to present their horse in person at either of these inspections without first obtaining the permission of the Technical Delegate or his representative, will be fined \$100.00. Horses not presented for a Horse Inspection are not eligible to start.

The first horse inspection will be held on Wednesday 2nd November in the afternoon for all Young Rider and Senior Championship horses. Smart casual dress of the handler is required. The time and location will be advised in the competitor information prior to the event. Young Rider and Senior Championship horses will be required to be on the grounds at Boneo Park by 1pm on Wednesday 2nd November. After the horse inspection and trot up both Young Rider and Senior horses may not leave the grounds for the duration of the event. Any horse in breach of this condition will be disqualified (Art 242 3.3).

The time and location of the second horse inspection will be advised at the event.

1a. Team nomination conditions

Team nominations must include full names of riders, full name of horse and Team Manager's details. Each state must nominate a team manager/Chef de Equipe.

The cost is \$300 per team. Entry forms will be sent to State Offices. Riders may only compete in one team for each age division. Teams must be nominated a day prior to the Teams Competition.

The starting order of the Teams Competition is determined by the draw.

A team constitutes three or four athletes. One team member may be from another State or Nation only if the State has insufficient Athlete numbers available.

The Teams Competitions are restricted to one team from each State, nominated by the State Branches.

The Teams Competition will be conducted in conjunction with the first qualifying competition and the first round of the second qualifying competition for the National Title Championship.

At the conclusion of the first qualifying competition the best three scores (as per individual scoring system) from each team are added together to give the team score.

At the conclusion of the first round of the second qualifying competition the best three scores (as per individual scoring system) from the team athletes will be added to the teams points from the first qualifying competition.

The team with the highest combined score will be the winner.

If there is equality of penalties for two or more teams for first or any subsequent places at the conclusion of the second round of the team competition, then the combined times of the three athletes who have contributed to the team score in the second round of the teams competition will be added together to give an overall team time. The team with the fastest combined time will be placed ahead of the other teams on the same number of penalties.

If two or more athletes of a team, participating with four athletes in the first or second round, are eliminated or retire, the whole team is eliminated. If one athlete of a team, participating with three athletes in the first or second round, is eliminated or retires, the whole team is eliminated.

2. Ruby Series nomination conditions

The Ruby Series is for horses with 40 points or less at close of entries. Points will be checked with the EA National database and incorrectly entered horses will be removed from the class without refund. All horses must meet the points criteria at the time of entries closing. Horses that exceed the stipulated points during the series will still be eligible for series qualifiers and finals.

Ruby Series will start at 125cm for the first round and will progress upwards over the following days.

Points will be allocated for the Ruby qualifier 1 and 2. The leader board from qualifier 1 and 2 will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall Ruby Series placings.

Horses in the Ruby Series are not eligible to enter any other series.

3. Emerald Series nomination condition

The Emerald Series is for horses with 16 points or less at close of entries. Points will be checked with the EA National database and incorrectly entered horses will be removed from the class without refund. All horses must meet the points criteria at the time of entries closing. Horses that exceed the stipulated points during the series will still be eligible for series qualifiers and finals.

The Emerald Series will start at 110cm for the first round and will progress upwards over the following days.

Points will be allocated for the Emerald Qualifier 1 and 2. The leader board of qualifier 1 & 2 will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall Emerald Series placings.

Horses in the Emerald Series are not eligible to enter any other series.

4. Amateur Series nomination conditions

All Amateur riders must be current EA members. Riders may compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years of age.

The course shall be free-flowing and relatively simple. The first fence in the first round shall be 110cm and the remainder of the course 110cm - 120cm max height. There will be a max height rise of 10cm for the jump off.

To compete as an Amateur rider, the following conditions must be met:

- Never competed in an Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in either Jumping or Eventing
- In the past 10 years must not have competed in a World Cup for Jumping Riders qualifying round or in a 4* three-day event.
- In the past two years must not have competed in section 1 and 2 at a Royal Show in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide or Perth
- Amateur riders may not compete in an Amateur Class if they compete in a class higher than 1.20m at that show
- Amateur riders may not compete in an Amateur Class on a horse that will compete in any class higher than 1.20m at that show

Points will be allocated for the Amateur qualifier 1 and 2. The leader board from qualifier 1 and 2 will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall placings in the Amateur Series.

Horses in the Amateur Series are not eligible to enter any other series.

5. Future Stars series nomination conditions

Future Stars is for Horses aged 6, 7 or 8 years old at the time of the competition. Nine year old horses are now also eligible for the Future Stars series at the 2022 AJC. Please note the young horse hind boot rule will apply.

Horses nominated in any Australian Jumping Championship (Children, Junior, Young Rider and Senior) are not eligible to enter The Future Stars.

Future Stars Series will start at 130cm for the first round and will progress upwards over the following days.

Points will be allocated for the Future Stars qualifier 1 and 2. The Leaderboard from qualifier 1 and 2 will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall placings in the Future Stars Series.

Horses in the Future Stars Series are not eligible to enter any other series.

6. Mini Prix series nomination conditions

Horses nominated in any Australian Jumping Championship (Children, Junior, Young Rider and Senior) are not eligible to enter the Mini Prix.

Mini Prix Series will start at 140cm for the first round and will progress upwards over the following days.

Points will be allocated for the Mini Prix qualifier 1 and 2. The leader board from qualifier 1 and 2 will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall Mini Prix placings.

Horses in the Mini Prix Series are not eligible to enter any other series.

7. Speed Championship nomination conditions

The Australian Speed Championship will be a minimum of 130cm.

Horses entered in the Speed Championship are allowed to enter another series so long as they meet the entry requirements.

8. Off The Track (OTT) nomination conditions

The OTT classes are open to Thoroughbreds that are 4 years old and over, and who are registered with the RISA (Racing Information Services Australia). Registrations will be checked by the Organising Committee and provided to Racing Victoria.

Racing Name to be used where appropriate. Racing name and microchip number will need to be provided with entry. There is no limit as to how long they have been out of racing.

First two rounds will be 110cm the final will not exceed 120cm.

Points will be allocated for rounds 1 and 2. The best placed 20 horses after round two will be eligible for the final.

Horses in the OTT class may enter any other series if they meet the qualification requirements.

9. Ivory Series nomination conditions

The maximum height of the three qualifying rounds is 80cm. The maximum height of the final is 85cm.

Points will be allocated for the Ivory series over the two qualifying rounds. The leaderboard after round two will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall placings in the Ivory Series.

Horses entered in the Ivory series may also compete in the Pearl series.

10. Pearl Series nomination conditions

The maximum height of the three qualifying rounds is 90cm. The maximum height of the final is 95cm.

Points will be allocated for the Pearl series over the three qualifying rounds. The leaderboard after round three will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall placings in the Pearl Series.

Horses may compete in a maximum of two of the Opal, Pearl or Ivory Series.

11. Opal Series nomination conditions

The maximum height of the three qualifying rounds is 100cm. The maximum height of the final is 104cm.

Points will be allocated for the Opal series over the three qualifying rounds. The leaderboard after round three will determine the top 50% of entrants who will be eligible for the final. Placings in the final will determine the overall placings in the Opal Series.

Horses entered in the Opal series may also compete in the Pearl Series.

Combinations in the Opal series may also compete in the Children's Championship if they qualify.

Additional Information

Code of Conduct / Appeals / Risk

Protests and Appeals: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$100.00 and lodged with the President of the Ground Jury within 30 minutes of the results being posted.

Welfare of the Horse

In all equestrian sports the horse must be considered paramount.

- The wellbeing of the horse shall be taken above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.
- All handling and veterinary treatment must ensure the health and welfare of the horse.
- The highest standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times.
- Adequate provision must be made for ventilation, feeding, watering and maintaining a healthy environment during transportation.
- Emphasis should be placed on increasing education in training and equestrian practices and on promoting scientific studies in equine health.
- In the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.
- All riding and training methods must take account of the horse as a living entity and must not include any technique considered by the FEI/EA to be abusive.
- National Federations should establish adequate controls in order that all persons and bodies under their jurisdiction respect the welfare of the horse.
- The national and international Rules and Regulations in equestrian sport regarding the health and welfare of the horse must be adhered to not only during the national and international events, but also in the training.
- Competition Rules and Regulations shall be continually reviewed to ensure such welfare.

Risk Management Conditions

1. Dogs are allowed at the venue, provided they are on a lead at all times. No dogs are allowed in the wetlands, restaurant, riders retreat, arenas or stable complex. All droppings must be picked up.
2. Approved safety helmets must be worn at all times when riding
3. Riding of horses bareback is prohibited
4. Riding of rugged and/or unbridled horses is prohibited
5. Stallions must at all times be in the control of a person as per the Equestrian Australia Stallion Policy.
6. Bicycles and scooters are not permitted in any stable block. Approved bicycle helmets must be worn at all times by all persons riding a bicycle or scooter.

7. Scooters must only be ridden at 'walking pace' and are not to be ridden down the main Boneo Park driveway. Horses have right of way at all times and scooter users must take all reasonable steps to ensure they do not spook horses.
8. Most of the Boneo Park property, other than the actual equestrian centre grounds, are a wetland and woodland of international significance, and there is a conservation covenant in place to protect the endangered flora and fauna. You are not permitted in the wetland areas surrounding the equestrian centre without permission, and horses or other animals are never allowed to enter this area.
9. Bicycles are not permitted near doors designated as public entrances or exits
10. Speed limits must be adhered to at all times, as horses will be in the vicinity
11. Power leads must not be on the ground
12. Construction of portable/tape yards is prohibited without prior approval
13. Alcohol must not be consumed by anyone riding later that day
14. Smoking is only permitted in the designated areas (Car park 2)
15. Children under 14 years must be under strict supervision at all times
16. No infrastructure to be erected on Boneo Park without prior approval by management. This includes stakes or pegs into the ground.
17. Trade space/ sponsors need to seek approval for positioning at Boneo Park.
18. Signage must be obeyed at all times

These conditions apply unless Boneo Park has given the discipline/event/activity concerned an exemption.

Each person visiting Boneo Park understands and complies with the following:

I acknowledge the contagious nature of the Coronavirus/COVID-19 and that the Australian government and health authorities still recommend practicing social distancing.

I further acknowledge that Boneo Park can not guarantee that I will not become infected with the Coronavirus/Covid-19. - * I have not been diagnosed with Coronavirus/Covid-19 and not yet cleared as non contagious health authorities.
- * I am following all recommended guidelines as much as possible and limiting my exposure to the Coronavirus/COVID-19.

These conditions apply unless Boneo Park has given the discipline/event/activity concerned an exemption.

Boneo Park Code of Conduct

The Boneo Park Equestrian Centre is an exclusive, private facility and in the interests of ensuring the enjoyment and safety of all users the following code of conduct applies. Management at Boneo Park can use discretion at any point in time to determine access to the facilities and are not limited to the code below.

Personal Conduct

- Must not use indecent, obscene, insulting or threatening language
- Must not behave in an offensive or indecent manner
- Must not cause serious alarm or affront to a person by disorderly or unsafe conduct
- Must not obstruct a person in the performance of that person's work or duties
- Boneo Park management do not tolerate the use, transfer or possession of illegal drugs on the premises. Anyone found using, transferring or in possession of any non-prescribed illegal drug will be ejected and may be handed over to the police.

Riding Conduct

- Approved safety helmets must be worn at all times when riding
- The FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse must be abided by at all times
- Smooth soled and heeled boots are worn.
- Riding of unsaddled or unbridled horses is prohibited
- Alcohol must not be consumed prior to riding
- Arena etiquette is observed eg:
 - Left hand to left hand
 - Walking give right of way
 - Diagonal changes have right of way
 - Uncontrolled horses are removed from the arena

General Conduct

- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times
- Speed limits must be adhered to at all times
- Only designated parking areas can be used
- Horses are not to be tied up to floats or trucks unless using twine and supervised
- Alcohol must not be consumed by anyone subsequently riding
- Smoking is prohibited everywhere except the designated smoking areas
- Bicycles and scooters are not permitted in any stable block. Approved bicycle helmets must be worn at all times by all persons riding a bicycle or scooter.
- Scooters must only be ridden at 'walking pace' and are not to be ridden down the main Boneo Park driveway. Horses have right of way at all times and scooter users must take all reasonable steps to ensure they do not spook horses.
- Children under 14 years must be under strict supervision at all times
- Horses must be led along laneways not the main drive
- Cars and vehicles are not allowed on horse laneways
- Please be aware that all fences are electric.
- Anyone conducting business at the Boneo Park facility, including professional photographers, must be approved by management prior.
- All coaches and other contractors or professionals conducting business at Boneo Park must have proof of current public liability insurance.

Anyone who does not abide by this code of conduct may be requested to leave the facility. Boneo Park management reserves the right to refuse entry to any individual.

Disclaimer of Liability

Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits, and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse, and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Neither Equestrian Victoria, Equestrian Australia, Boneo Park, nor the Organising Committee or their appointed officials accept any liability for any accident, theft or illness to horses, riders, grooms or any person or property whatsoever.
