#### Prize money - over \$100,000

Please read this carefully to ensure prompt payment of your prize money. Height classes, Ivory, Pearl and Opal series will be paid in cash from the event office. All other Championship and Series prize money will be direct debited to your account.

It is vital that you provide the correct BSB and account number when entering the show. If these details are supplied correctly prize money will be transferred within three weeks from the end of the show. Unclaimed prize money will be held for no more than three months from the end of the show.

# **Conditions of Entry**

This event will run under EA/FEI rules and regulations. The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to change or amend the program at their discretion. All owners and competitors will be personally responsible for damages to any third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Please ensure the safety of your children whilst in proximity to horses.

#### **Conduct of the Organising Committee**

The Technical Delegate, Ground Jury, Officials, Boneo Park and Equestrian Australia (EA) are responsible for ensuring Horse Welfare guidelines are observed. Additionally, the above-mentioned groups are responsible for ensuring that EA and Boneo Park Codes of Conduct are adhered to at all times.

General Regs Article 116.11 - The OC may at their absolute discretion and shall, if they consider it expedient to do so, decline to receive any entry or return any fee without being liable for any compensation.

#### **Block Entry**

There will be a block entry for all Championship classes and all Series. The block entry for these Championships/Series will include two rounds/qualifying classes and a final class for those that qualify. There are additional height classes that can be entered individually.

#### **Scratching / refunds of entries**

All scratchings prior to close of entries will be refunded in full less a \$60 administration fee. Once the entries have closed, no refunds will be given unless a veterinary or medical certificate is provided within seven days of the event. If a veterinary or medical certificate is supplied within the given timeframe 50% of entry fees paid will be refunded. #### Late entries and class changes

There will be no further late entries accepted from close of business on 22nd October. Any class change, horse change or rider change will incur a \$30 admin fee. You may transfer from one class to another or make a rider change so long as both the horse and rider have an entry up until the start of the show. Once the show is underway there is no transferring from one class to another and no rider changes. The only exception is the height classes which can be entered at the show subject to availability.

#### Refunds of stables/yards/campsites

Once the portable stables are built, there will be no refunds on stables regardless of whether the show goes ahead or not. For yards and campsites - more than seven days from the event, yard and camping fees will be refunded in full less a \$60 administration fee. Within seven days of the event, refunds, less the \$60 administration fee, will be given if the yard and/or campsite can be filled. No refund will occur once the event has started. For biosecurity, you must clear any stabling changes with the Event Secretary or Stable Manager.

#### **Cancellation of event**

If Boneo Park cancels the event due to Covid-19, extreme weather conditions, low numbers or other unforeseen circumstances, Boneo Park reserves the right to retain a \$60 administration fee per rider. All other money paid will be refunded. There will be no refunds once the event has started.

#### Starts per horse / Riders per horse

Each horse is only permitted to enter one championship/series, with the exception of the Ivory, Pearl and Opal series, where horses may enter two consecutive levels. Each horse is only permitted one rider for the event. This includes the Open height classes, no exceptions. The OC reserves the right to restrict the number of horses entered by one rider in any class depending on entries.

#### **Riders and Owners**

All riders and owners must be current financial members of EA with no exception. All horses and ponies must hold current EA registration and jumping licenses, with the exception of those competing in the Ivory, Pearl and Opal series who need base registration.

#### EA age rules

The following EA age rules apply:

- Children Riders are considered children from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 10 up until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 14 years old.
- **Junior** Riders are considered Juniors, from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years old.
- Young Rider Riders are considered Young riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years old.
- **Senior Rider** Riders are considered Senior riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 18.





• **Amateur** - Riders may compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years of age.

For the Senior Championship horses must be eight years old, or over, on the first day of Competition.

#### **Dress Code**

Riders in all competition rings must be in correct dress unless otherwise instructed by the judge. It is compulsory for athletes to wear a properly fastened safety EA approved helmet at all times whilst mounted. The only exception to this is Senior athletes may remove their helmet at the presentation in the competition arena only. All helmets must be tagged.

#### **Presentations**

Presentations will be mounted, and riders must wear their correct attire. Riders who are not available for presentations or who do not fulfill any media commitments that may be required by the OC, may forfeit all prize money. Winners of classes may be required to participate in photo and media obligations.

All competitors are required to stay at Boneo Park until the completion of the final presentations.

#### **Stallions**

The OC follows the EA Stallion Code of Conduct.

#### Dogs

Dogs must be kept on a leash and under effective control at all times. Dogs are not permitted in warm up or competition areas.

Boneo Park reserves the right to change or amend the program at their discretion.





## **Nomination Conditions for Championship Titles**

The Championship comprises three competitions, two qualifying competitions and a final competition, each taking place on a different day.

Horses are only allowed to compete in one Championship Class. Once you have started in a Championship class that horse must not start in any other Championship class. The Championship classes are shown in Table 1. Horses in the Championship classes must stay on the grounds at the event from the day before the first qualifier until after the final. Any horse in breach of this rule will be disqualified from the competition. Inspections will take place.

All horses in the Championship classes must wear a bridle number. The bridle number will be the horse number assigned to each horse in the scoring system Equipe.

The obstacle dimensions are shown in Table 1.

### Children, Junior, Young Rider and Senior Championships

#### Allocation of Points for the First and Second Qualifying Competitions

The winner of each competition gets one point more than the number of starters in the first qualifying competition. The second placed gets two points less than the winner, the third placed three points less than the winner, and so on.





**Athletes eliminated or retiring**: Athletes who have been eliminated or have retired in the initial round of the first two competitions do not get points and are not eligible for the third and final Competition.

**Equality of points among Athletes**: Points won by Athletes who are tied are added up and divided equally. Fractions of 0.5 and more are rounded up; fractions of less than 0.5 are rounded down.

#### Transformation of points to penalties

After the second qualifying competition points are transformed into penalties. The Athlete with the highest number of points after the two competitions will have 0 penalties. For all other Athletes the number of penalties will be calculated by multiplying with the coefficient of 0.50 the difference between their number of points and the points of the leading Athlete after the two competitions. In this procedure all decimals are rounded down.

#### Classification

The overall Champion will be the athlete with the lowest number of penalties after the three Competitions. An athlete who qualifies for Round B of the third and Final Competition but who does not start in Round B will be ranked equal with other athletes who started in Round B and are eliminated or retired in Round B of the Final Competition. If athletes are tied for first place after the three Competitions, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a reduced course of at least six obstacles. In case of equality of penalties and time in this jump-off a second jump-off, against the clock, will be held over the same course. Athletes not in the jump-off but tying on penalties will be separated for the purpose of the Final overall classification by their time in the second round of the Third Competition.

#### Starting order for Second Qualifying Competition and Final

In the Second Qualifying Competition, the starting order is according to the reverse order of points allocated after the First Qualifying Competition. The starting order in Rounds A and B of the Third Competition is, respectively, according to the reverse order of penalties (i.e. points transformed into penalties) after the second Qualifying Competition, and after Round A of the Third Competition. Athletes with equality of points (after the first Qualifying Competition) or penalties (after the second Qualifying Competition or after Round A of the Third Competition) will retain the same starting order among themselves as in the previous Competition or round, whichever is applicable.

#### **Design and construction**

The design and construction of all obstacles with regard to safety and technical suitability must be approved by the Technical Delegate and Course Designer. The minimum diameter of poles used in all Championship Competitions must be at least 9 cm. Should a dispute arise relating to these obstacles, the Technical Delegate has the final decision.

#### Water jump

The water jump must be used in the first qualifier with rails above, and without rails in the first round of the final competition of the Championship for Seniors, Young Riders and Juniors. For Seniors it must be dug in. An above ground water jump is allowed for Young Riders and Juniors.

#### **First Qualifying Competition**

This First Qualifying Competition is conducted over a Table A course and judged under Table C (JRs Art. 239 and 263) without a jump-off in the event of equality for first place. The first qualifying competition for the Children's' Championship will be conducted under table A against the clock. Article 238 2.1. There will be no jump-off in the event of equality for first place. Athletes will be allocated points for their placing according to penalties and time.

**Obstacles**: 12 to 14 obstacles, including one double and one treble, or two or three doubles.

**Height**: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height. **Length**: 500 m (min) to 600 m (max).

**Starting order**: The starting order for the first Competition is a random draw.

#### Second Qualifying Competition - Conduct, Table, Speed

This Second Qualifying Competition is conducted over one round run under Table A against the clock at a speed of 375 m per minute for Seniors and Young Riders and 350m per minute for Juniors with one jump-off. (JRs Article 238 2.2) Athletes and Horses which are tied for first place at the conclusion of the first round will jump off against the clock.

**Obstacles**: 12 to 14 obstacles, including one double and one treble or two or three doubles.

**Height**: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height. A maximum of two spread obstacles with a width of one metre or less may be used. At least two vertical obstacles must be maximum in height. Sloping walls do not count as compulsory vertical obstacles.

**Length**: 500 m (min) to 700 m (max).

#### **Starting order for Second Qualifying Competition**

In the second qualifying competition, the starting order is according to the reverse order of points allocated after the first qualifying competition. Only the Athletes and Horses which have taken part in the first competition, may take part in the second qualifying competition.

#### **Third and Final Competition**

Either 50% or the 20 best placed Athletes, whichever is greater, after the second qualifying Competition qualify for the first round (A) of the Third and Final Competition. Athletes on the same penalties for the twentieth/50% position will all be eligible to start in the Round A of the Final. If there are less than 20 athletes who have elected to start in Round A of the Final they will be replaced by the next best placed athlete. A maximum of five athletes may be replaced.





#### Conduct, Table, Speed

The Third and Final Competition is conducted over two rounds (A) and (B) each judged under Table A against the clock with a time allowed at a speed of 375 m per minute for Seniors and Young Riders and 350m per minute for Juniors.

15 Athletes return for the second round of the final competition.

#### Round A

**Obstacles**: 10 to 12 obstacles, including one double and one treble or three doubles.

**Water jump**: The water jump must be used without rails in the first round of the final competition of the Championship for Seniors, Young Riders and Juniors. For Seniors it must be dug in. An above ground water jump is allowed for Young Riders and Juniors.

**Height**: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height. At least two vertical obstacles, which must be at maximum height. Water Jump must be used (see Art. 324.3): maximum 3.6 metres (including the take-off element).

**Length**: 500 m (min) to 600 m (max).

**Starting Order**: The starting order in round A of the third and final competition is according to the reverse order of penalties (i.e. points transformed into penalties) after the second qualifying competition.

#### Round B

**Obstacles**: A different course from round A comprising eight to 10 obstacles including only one combination (one double or one treble).

**Height**: As shown in Table 1, with the spread in proportion to the height. At least two vertical obstacles, which must be at maximum height.

**Water jump**: A water jump may not be included, but an obstacle with water beneath, in front or behind (a so called "Liverpool") may be included in the course.

**Length**: 400 m (min) to 500 m (max).

**Participation**: At the completion of Round A of the Third and Final Competition the 15 best placed athletes qualify for the second round, Round (B) of the Final. Athletes on the same penalties for the fifteenth position will all be eligible to start in Round B of the final. Athletes who elect not to start in Round B will not be replaced and will be placed equal.





**Starting order**: The starting order in Round B of the Third and Final Competition is, according to the reverse order of penalties (i.e. points transformed into penalties) after the Second Qualifying Competition, and after Round A of the Third and Final Competition.

#### **Determination of the Australian Champion**

The overall Champion will be the Athlete with the lowest number of penalties after the three Competitions. An Athlete who qualifies for Round B of the third and Final Competition but who does not start in Round B will be ranked equal with other Athletes who started in Round B and are eliminated or retired in Round B of the Final Competition.

If athletes are tied for first place after the three Competitions, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a reduced course of at least six obstacles. In case of equality of penalties and time in this jump-off a second jump-off, against the clock, will be held over the same course. Athletes not in the jump-off but tying on penalties will be separated for the purpose of the Final overall classification by their time in the second round of the Third Competition.

If due to any unforeseen circumstances the third and Final Competition is unable to be run the Championships will be awarded to the Athlete/s with the highest number of points after the first two Competitions. If the Second Qualifying Competition is not completed no Championship will be awarded. No other class will be run in conjunction with the Third and Final Competition.

#### How many starts

An athlete may ride no more than three horses (if entries permit) in any one championship division. In the case of excessive entries, the OC reserves the right to restrict a rider to two starts.

Competitors, whose age allows them, may compete in two consecutive divisions, i.e. Children's and Junior, Junior and Young Rider or Young Rider and Senior. However, they must compete on different horses.

#### **Horse Inspection/Trot up**

All Athletes competing in the Senior and Young Rider Championships must present their own Horse(s) at the first Horse Inspection, which will be held on the day preceding the first qualifying Competition and at the second horse inspection, which will be held after the second qualifying competition and prior to the final.

Any Athlete who fails to present their Horse in person at this inspection without first obtaining the permission of the Technical Delegate or his representative, may be fined \$100.00. Horses not presented for the Horse Inspection are not eligible to start.

After the horse inspection all horses may not leave the grounds for the duration of the event. Any horse in breach of this condition will be disqualified. The time and location of the horse inspections will be advised prior to the start of the event.

## Mini Prix, Future Stars and Amateur Championships

#### First and Second Qualifying Competitions

Special Two-Phase Competition, Competitions to be run on two separate days. This Competition comprises two phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase. The first phase is a course of five to seven obstacles with or without combinations. The total number of obstacles in both phases is a minimum of 11 and maximum of 13 obstacles. The second phase may include one combination. Athletes completing the first phase may continue in the second phase.

The second phase finishes after crossing its finishing line. This competition must be judged in accordance with the following formula: First Phase Table A Not against the clock Minimum 5 - Maximum 7 Obstacle Second Phase Table A Against the clock Remaining obstacles (Total of minimum 11 and obstacles and maximum 13 obstacles in both phases) Placing According to the aggregate penalties in both phases (Faults on obstacles and penalties for exceeding the time allowed in both phases) and, if necessary, according to the time of the second phase. Athletes who are eliminated, retire or do not finish, from either the first or second phase will not be placed. In the event of equality for first place, the tied athletes will be placed equal first.

#### **Third and Final Competition**

In order to fulfil the eligibility requirement for Horses taking part in the Final both phases of the Competition conducted according to Art. 274.2.5 must be completed. Any horse eliminated in the first or second qualifying competition are not eligible to start in the final. The final will be run under article 238 2.2.

Either 50% or a minimum of the 20 best athletes will qualify for the final. Scratchings or withdrawals up to a maximum of five athletes may be replaced. Order of starting in the final is seeded, based on the placings in the qualifying competition.

All combinations qualified to start in the final will start on zero points. The winner of the final competition will be the Australian Champion.

Future Stars is for Horses aged 6, 7 or 8 years old at the time of the competition. Please note the young horse hind boot rule will apply.

To compete as an Amateur rider, the following conditions must be met:

- Never competed in an Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in either Jumping or Eventing
- In the past 10 years must not have competed in a World Cup for Jumping Riders qualifying round or in a 4\* three-day event.
- In the past two years must not have competed in section 1 and 2 at a Royal Show in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide or Perth

- Amateur riders may not compete in an Amateur Class if they compete in a class higher than 1.20m at that show
- Amateur riders may not compete in an Amateur Class on a horse that will compete in any class higher than 1.20m at that show

## Nomination Conditions for Series (Ruby, Emerald, Off The Track, Opal, Pearl, Ivory Series)

The Series comprises three competitions, round 1 and round 2 competitions and a final competition for those that qualify, each taking place on a different day. The heights for each series are shown in Table 2.

For the series classes article 274 2.5 (Special Two-Phase) and article 238 2.2 will be used for Round 1 and Round 2, one on each day. The final will be article 238 2.2.

Either 50% or a minimum of the 20 best athletes will qualify for the final. Scratchings or withdrawals up to a maximum of 5 athletes may be replaced.

Order of starting in the final is seeded, based on the placings in Round 1 and Round 2.

The winner of the final competition will be the winner of the Series.





## **Ruby and Emerald Series**

The Ruby and Emerald series will have an A and B section. Section A is open to all horses who meet entry criteria and section B is age restricted. The Ruby section B is for horses who are seven years old and under (actual date of birth) on the first day of competition. The Emerald section B is for horses who are six years old and under (actual date of birth) on the first day of competition.

Horses in the Ruby and Emerald Series are not allowed to compete in any other Series or Championship.

#### **Off The Track Series**

The OTT classes are open to Thoroughbreds that are 4 years old and over, and who are registered with the RISA (Racing Information Services Australia). Registrations will be checked by the Organising Committee and provided to Racing Victoria.

Racing Name to be used where appropriate. Racing name and microchip number will need to be provided with entry. There is no limit as to how long they have been out of racing.

### Ivory, Pearl and Opal Series

Horses in the Ivory, Pearl and Opal Series may compete in a maximum of two consecutive series.

- Horses entered in the Ivory series may also compete in the Pearl series.
- Horses entered in the Pearl series may also compete in the Ivory or the Opal but not both.
- Horses entered in the Opal series may also compete in the Pearl Series.

## **Height Class**

Height classes are for horses that have finished in their championship or series (not jumping in the final). You can not start in a height class if you are still competing in a championship or series. Entries will be accepted into the height classes at the show event office, subject to availability.





# **Additional Information**

### **Code of Conduct /Appeals / Risk**

**Protests and Appeals**: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$200.00 and lodged with the President of the Ground Jury within 30 minutes of the results being posted.

#### Welfare of the Horse

In all equestrian sports the welfare of the horse must be considered paramount.

- The wellbeing of the horse shall be taken above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.
- All handling and veterinary treatment must ensure the health and welfare of the horse.
- The highest standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times.
- Adequate provision must be made for ventilation, feeding, watering and maintaining a healthy environment during transportation.
- Emphasis should be placed on increasing education in training and equestrian practices and on promoting scientific studies in equine health.
- In the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.
- All riding and training methods must take account of the horse as a living entity and must not include any technique considered by the FEI/EA to be abusive.
- National Federations should establish adequate controls in order that all persons and bodies under their jurisdiction respect the welfare of the horse.
- The national and international Rules and Regulations in equestrian sport regarding the health and welfare of the horse must be adhered to not only during the national and international events, but also in the training.
- Competition Rules and Regulations shall be continually reviewed to ensure such welfare.

These conditions apply unless Boneo Park has given the discipline/event/activity concerned an exemption.

#### **Boneo Park Code of Conduct**

An entry into the 2025 Pet Circle Australian Jumping Championships confirms acceptance and compliance with all of the below conditions:

Insurance: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The Boneo Park Equestrian Centre is an exclusive, private facility and in the interests of ensuring the enjoyment and safety of all users the following code of conduct applies. Management at Boneo Park can use discretion at any point in time to determine access to the facilities and are not limited to the code below.

A person must not do any of the following whilst at Boneo Park:

#### **Personal Conduct**

- use indecent, obscene, insulting or threatening language
- behave in an offensive or indecent manner
- cause serious alarm or affront to a person by disorderly or unsafe conduct
- obstruct a person in the performance of that person's work or duties
- Boneo Park management do not tolerate the use, transfer or possession of illegal drugs on the premises. Anyone found using, transferring or in possession of any non-prescribed illegal drug will be ejected and may be handed over to the police.





#### **Riding Conduct**

- Approved AS/ NZ 3838 safety helmets must be worn at all times when riding
- The FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse must be abided by at all times
- Smooth soled and heeled boots are worn.
- Riding of unsaddled or unbridled horses is prohibited
- Alcohol must not be consumed prior to riding

#### **General Conduct**

- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times
- Speed limits must be adhered to at all times
- Only designated parking areas can be used
- The agistment facility must only be accessed by current agistees of Boneo Park, or with prior permission
- The machinery and work area at the south of the agistment facility are prohibited
- Please be aware that motorised plant and equipment operates throughout the venue at all times
- Horses are not to be tied up to floats or trucks unless using twine and supervised
- Alcohol must not be consumed by anyone subsequently riding
- Smoking is prohibited everywhere except the designated smoking area in car park 2
- Bicycles and scooters are not permitted in any stable block. Approved bicycle helmets must be worn at all times by all persons riding a bicycle or scooter.
- Scooters must only be ridden at 'walking pace' and are not to be ridden down the main Boneo Park driveway. Horses have right of way at all times and scooter users must take all reasonable steps to ensure they do not spook horses.
- Children under 14 years must be under strict supervision at all times
- Horses must be led along laneways not the main drive
- Cars and vehicles are not allowed on horse laneways
- Please be aware that all fences are electric.
- All electrical leads should be safe tested and tagged and not in contact with the ground or wet areas
- All LPG cylinders must be safe and be only used according to its specifications and stored in an upright and safe manner away from ignition sources and only stored in permitted areas
- Anyone conducting business at the Boneo Park facility, including all contractors and professional photographers, must be approved by management and inducted prior to arrival on site.
- All coaches and other contractors or professionals conducting business at Boneo Park must have proof of current public liability insurance.

Anyone who does not abide by this code of conduct may be requested to leave the facility. Boneo Park management reserves the right to refuse entry to any individual.





### **Disclaimer of Liability**

Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits, and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse, and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Neither Equestrian Victoria, Equestrian Australia, Boneo Park, nor the Organising Committee or their appointed officials accept any liability for any accident, theft or illness to horses, riders, grooms or any person or property whatsoever.
